TCS this past week:

WATSON-Have started learning about the Stone Age in history. They enjoyed sharing fun facts about the topic.

TAJIRI- Have made spiral leaf sculptures inspired by Andy Goldsworthy, the nature artist. In forest school, they made boats out of corks and searched for fossils.

THUNBERG- Have enjoyed their new science topic. They looked at how plants reproduce and dissected them to reinforce their learning.

WILLIAMS- Were introduced to the text 'Max and the Million'. Students made predictions, revised modal verbs and focused on writing using paragraphs.
