TURING- Have been working hard to identify quotation evidence in Act 2 of Macbeth. In Science, they have been looking at ionic and covalent bonds.

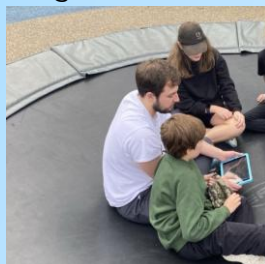
EILISH- Have been learning about the impact of tsunamis on migration in Humanities, they have also continued to investigate forces in Science.
