Reading is hugely beneficial for developing literacy skills, and we are pleased to offer pupils access to Wheelers Online Library. This digital platform provides over 300,000 eBooks and eAudiobooks, available on most devices including tablets, laptops and smartphones.

Pupils can read online or download books for offline use via the ePlatform app or web browser. Wheelers includes helpful features such as adjustable font sizes, dyslexia-friendly settings and automatic returns, with no late fees. Age filters and content controls are also in place to ensure a safe reading environment.

Login details will be shared separately. We encourage families to explore the platform together and welcome any feedback or book requests.
