Turing – Have been looking at how to write an engaging newsletter article in English. In Science they have learned about potential difference.

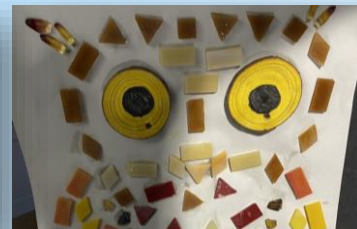
Eilish – Have started a new unit on elements and the periodic table in Science. They have also been completing their 3D constructions in Art.
